PRESIDENT'S MESSAGE

I am well pleased at the state of the organization. We have a committee of dedicated volunteers prepared to devote time from their busy schedules on your behalf. Future courses can be made more relevant to you only if you make your wishes known, and all that it takes is a short note, fax or telephone call to any one of the staff or the Board.

Finally, David Ruddy's introduction and explanation of the OMMC Inc.'s coat of arms sparked much discussion about our perception of the organization. All of the comments will be taken under advisement. The Board believes that the spin-offs from the selection of a suitable design, in the form of plaques, blazer crests and flags, etc, will result in enhanced recognition for the OMMC, Inc. and will be a cohesive influence for our members.

y now most people are aware of the auction of the medals and military memorabilia of LCol John McCrae, in which bureaucratic procrastination and indifference almost resulted in the loss of these medals to a foreign buyer. Thanks to the patriotic action of Mr. Arthur Lee of Scarborough, Ontario, who paid the \$400,000 hammer price, plus the auctioneer's 10% commission, as well as 7% GST, the medals were retained in Canada and donated to the McCrae House Museum in Guelph, Ontario. Hopefully, the Federal Government is now aware that the ordinary Canadian does care about Canada's military history, its veterans and the importance of remembering those who died in the service of their country.

nd in the National Capital, there is a great controversy over the inclusion of a Holocaust exhibition hall in the soon-to-beexpanded display area of the Canadian War Museum. Some of our members are involved in the controversy. Members who operate military museums are encouraged to take advantage of this situation and voice their opinions, while at the same time, draw attention to the existence and services of their own military museums. Many people in your community may not be aware of your museum. The current debate could provide an opportunity to raise public awareness of your museum through letters to local newspapers, interviews with local radio and TV stations, and so forth.
