EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE'S REPORT

The Executive Committee wishes to thank the retiring Executive and Board members, Frank Dunbar, Marilyn Gurney and Brenda Brownlee, and to acknowledge their hard work and dedication to the organization, particularly during the past few years, which have seen many changes to the OMMC.

MEMBERSHIP CATEGORIES

As noted in the previous issue, the Executive has been reviewing the OMMC, Inc's categories of memberships and the definitions of these categories. Letters have been sent out to members currently listed in "organization" category, requesting information but with minimal response to date. Member participation in this review is important to ensure that any decisions are based on accurate information.

HIGHLIGHTS - AG M 1996

The 1996 AGM was held in the main auditorium, Canadian Emergency Preparedness College, Amprior, Ontario, 1600 hours Monday 12 August 1996.

One item of business from the previous AGM was raised, concerning the Education Fund. The President noted that these monies were held as a contingency reserve and therefore no action has been taken to expend these funds. In response to a question from the floor concerning expenditure of donations each year, vis a vis the DND funding, the President explained that since this was a grant, not a donation, the Revenue Canada rule did not apply.

The financial statements for the year ending 31 December 1995 were presented. The balance sheet showed Assets of \$128,380, Liabilities of \$54,046, and Members' Equity of \$74,334. The report was adopted and the firm of D.P. Johnson, C.A., of Nepean, Ont. was reappointed as the auditor for the corporation for the coming year. The possible separation of bookkeeping and auditing functions is being assessed, but no changes will be made until 1997.

Annual reports were presented by the

President and the Executive Director, covering the activities of the year since the 1995 AGM. The President noted that the Board relied more on teleconferences to reduce costs and facilitate attendance at meetings. He also encouraged members to submit articles and notices to "The Bulletin".

Under Other Business, the President noted that our correspondence to the Dept of Justice concerning the new Firearms Legislation had little impact. Bruce Savage's motion of appreciation to Harry Bloom, Operations Manager of CEPC and the Course Co-ordinator for an excellent course package was unanimously approved.

ANNUAL COURSE - 1997

As noted in the previous issue, the 1997 course will be hosted by CFB Esquimalt, Victoria, BC. The course dates have yet to be confirmed, but we still anticipate the late August - early September time frame. The Course Planning Team will be making its recce to Victoria before the end of November.
